14 students achieved exclusively A/A* grades at A Level



What is the Early Entry Programme?

 The bespoke Oxbridge and Early-entry Programme encourages and supports students who may have the potential and the ambition to apply for:

Medicine - Chemistry + Biology + Maths / Physics (AAA)

*Most, but not all medical schools require maths
Chemistry + Biology plus another (AAA)

Dentistry - Chemistry + Biology plus another (AAA)

Veterinary Science - Biology + 2 others (normally science disciplines) (AAA)

What is the 16 to 19 Bursary?

Financial support, dependent upon a student's household income, to remove financial barriers to education.

- Transport for students who use public transport and live more than 3 miles from sixth form
- Essential course related fieldtrips, books and equipment – to be returned to sixth form upon completion of your studies
- Trips and visits organized by the Sixth Form to prepare students for the future
- The costs of attending university interviews and open days
- The costs of attending apprenticeship interviews
- Temporary meal support

- Pathway 2 3 A Level/BTEC qualifications and qualification enrichment –
 the EPQ
- Pathway 3 3 A Level/BTEC qualifications and qualification enrichment –

What do I need to achieve?

The General Entry Requirements are:

Five GCSE/Level 2 qualifications at Grade 5 or above including a Grade 5 in Mathematics and a Grade 5 in *either* English Literature *or* English Language.

Course Preference Requests for 2023 entry are now available to submit via an online form. Do so before November 29^{th.} This is to enable course combinations can be taken into account when constructing the timetable.




What makes the difference?
