Write 75 words.

Draw 6 images which reflect the action in the poem, e.g. the charge of the soldier across the battlefield. Write the corresponding quote underneath each image.



Compare this poem with The Charge of the Light Brigade. Is the message about war and patriotism the same? Write 150 words.

Bayonet Charge

Write down the words and phrases which bring a sense of hell to the battlefield. Explode these quotes, i.e. annotate them and explain what the language means.

Look at the beginning of the poem. How does the writer throw the reader into the action and violence? Look at the use of language and structure.
