- Importance of routine and habit





Accelerated Reader Login


Reading speeds – normal speaking speed



19,000 words at 150 words per minutes = approx. 2 hours




25, 000 words = approx. 2 and a half hours



43, 000 words approx. 4.30

Intervention for children 2-3 years behind with reading age



Accuracy

Reading aloud is an excellent indication of how well a child is reading

- accurate (at least 97% = no more than 4 mistakes a minute)
- normal speaking speed
- nice intonation

We have some tips for how and when to correct mistakes

Practice makes permanent

Spelling intervention

Process

- SATs results as indicator
- Tested for spelling age
- 12 sessions
- Tailored to the group
- Common problems are suffixes and prefixes (adding –ed, -ing)
- Patterns in word structure and word families helps vocabulary learning too
