

How should we approach learning at home for Art?

How long should I spend on Art each week?

You should be trying to follow your timetable – this means a minimum of two lessons of studying Art across the fortnight for year 7, 8 and 9. We recommend you take time with each task, working at home will allow you more time to refine your work if you wish. Remember quality is always better than quantity. Lessons should be at least 40 minutes long.

What topics should I be studying for Art?

All work is on the school website, shared area and the Onedrive. Find which method of access works best for you. In each area you will follow a PowerPoint at your own pace; there are enough resources for twelve weeks and we will be adding more for extension. **Feedback for all Year 7, 8 and 9 Art work will be updated following the end of that week's task. Please read it and reflect on your successes and potential areas to develop.**

What should I be doing each day then?

Again we recommend 40 minutes, however you may find that you want to spend longer on a task... this is absolutely fine, quality is always better than quantity.

Where possible, we are adding examples in the PowerPoints to allow you and your parents to complete regular self-assessment to keep you on track.
