

How should we approach learning at home for Economics?

How long should I spend on Economics each week?

You should be trying to follow your timetable – this means approximately **5 hours** of studying Economics across the fortnight for KS4.

How should I study?

At school, lessons last for 60 minutes but it's hard to study like this independently. Instead, it may be beneficial to aim for 2 x 20/30 minute sessions on the days you're due to study Economics; you could do one session of work in the morning and one in the afternoon perhaps.

Please check the home learning page on the website, or the home learning folder on the school network each Monday as new lesson instructions/activities will be set each week, starting from Monday 30th March. These will be updated each weekend during term time.

Where should I be putting my work?

Write in your exercise books as much as possible. Give your work a clear and neat date and title to help stay organised, and label the topic accordingly. For worksheets and some practice questions, you can complete these on the computer and upload to the class OneNote / Microsoft Teams as instructed.

We have created a Microsoft Teams page and a class notebook dedicated to our class. It has been shared with you via email. Log into Office 365 go to Teams / OneNote and have a look around. Work set will always be on the school website but marked assignments will also be set via the Teams app sometimes. Evidence of each weeks' class notes / general written work should be uploaded to your section in the class OneNote as a photo / screenshot.

What topics should I be studying for Economics?

It would be recommended to spend 1 hour per fortnight reviewing / revising work done to date, but specific lessons will also be planned to ensure appropriate consolidation of year 1 content already covered.

The medium term plan is to cover the following topic areas over the coming weeks:

- 2.6 Production
- 2.7 The labour market
- 2.8 The role of money and financial markets

So how do I know that what I'm doing is right? How will I receive feedback?

A selection of the work you do will be marked and graded by your teacher and work evidence that you have uploaded to OneNote will be reviewed and commented on if necessary to address any misconceptions / issues.

For practice exam questions, model answers will be shared as well as answers for worksheets / textbook activities which can be self-reviewed to check your understanding is correct.

End of unit tests and practice papers will be provisioned in the future, digitally submitted and marked.
