- The effect the costume has on the audience**
- The context of the act (location, year)**
- The realism of the costume**

What is a costume designer?

A costume designer is a person who designs costumes for a film, stage, production or television. The role of the costume designer is to create create the characters' outfits/costumes.

Key Words and Definitions

- Colour** - The connotations of the colour (What the colour represents and how it reflects the character)
- Material/Texture** - The quality of the material such as Rags, Leather, Fur
- Hair and Make-up** - How this fits in with the time period and the costume
- The fit of the costume/How the costume is presented** - How is the costume worn? How does it fit on the actor (Tight, Over-Sized, Flowy)
- Style of the play** - How the costume will fit the theme/location of the play.
- Accessories** - Such as Hats, Canes and Umbrellas

Top Tip

When designing and creating a costume, it is important to label each part of the costume in detail and to give reasons for your design choices.

Quick Costume Design

Red - Colour connoting Blood, Themes of Evil and Death

Lace Fabric - Upper class and sophistication

Gold - connotes Royalty and Purity

Red shoes - colour could suggest her personality of power hunger
