

To the families of any child who rides a bicycle

Dear Parent, Guardians and Carers

It is fantastic that increasing numbers of students are cycling to school. However, following a recent flurry of complaints, from residents, passing motorists and our own staff, it can only be a matter of time before a serious accident happens.

Not all children who cycle to school do so irresponsibly, but a substantial number are currently doing so. I would imagine that the same is true outside of school journeys as well.

Please support us in talking to your child about how they ride their bicycle. In particular:

- 1. When meeting up to ride to school, cyclists should be aware of other road users and pedestrians. Six or seven bikes together are a formidable obstacle to somebody trying to get past.
- 2. Ignoring traffic instructions. A red light means stop! Some of our children are weaving in and out of cars, off and on pavements, and riding in a reckless manner. Even if the cyclist is fine, a car trying to take avoiding action can lead to an accident.
- 3. Around the school entrance, cyclists are dodging in and out of the traffic putting both themselves and others at risk.
- 4. Check the bicycle do the brakes work?
- 5. Can your child be seen? The days are slowly growing longer but we still have gloomy mornings and evenings. Lights would be great or at the very least there are all sorts of reflective strips that are effective.
- 6. Wear a helmet. The mindset of teenagers is hardwired into a belief that they are indestructible; sadly, they are not. A helmet can save a life or injury.
