Building Work

- **D Block** - I will be around to finish D block...well not me personally with a hod and wheelbarrow, but I will oversee it all along with the School Business Manager and the Facilities Manager. It looks like it will not be ready for when we hoped, due to an issue about steel work. So we will be well into April, or more likely early May, before we can move in.
- **Technology Toilets** - The toilets in the technology block will be out of action for about six weeks in the New Year whilst they are ripped out and replaced. Hopefully this will straddle Easter to reduce the amount of time they are out of action to the students. When this work is finished, it will increase the number of toilets around school. Also, whilst we are retaining the idea of 'open toilets', cubicle doors will be full height for total privacy.
- **Roofs** - The roofers are pretty much on target and the sports hall is virtually finished. Fascias will go on in the New Year. Once they have finished they will flick over to the main school where the main hall, canteen and house offices will all end with a new roof. If you can picture it the canteen has roof lights and therefore part of it will have to be cordoned off. This should not affect the serveries but we will need to use the hall as an overspill for eating.
- **Bids for Next Year** - We hope to be able to replace the mobile classrooms as well as completing the roofing project. We should know the outcome by March 2019.

The tournament was held at the famous Kensington Oval cricket stadium in Bridgetown. They overcame Atlantis (USA), Barbados, Guadeloupe and Ponty Butchers (Wales) to win the tournament and the \$10,000 prize money, which has been donated to the team's charity 'The Doddie Weir Foundation'. I would also like to point out that Mr Elliot was player of the tournament!

Rail Crossing Closure

The B5074 will be shut at the railway crossing between 5th and 14th January 2019. If you're struggling to think of where this is then, coming from Cheerbrooks, go straight across at the lights; if travelling out of Nantwich, it is the road with the Leopard Pub on it. Do please allow extra time for your journey if this is your normal way to school. It will also push more traffic past the school as well, so there could be considerable congestion and delays for all. Network Rail has offered this advice, 'We understand that closing the road is inconvenient and we thank the local community and road users for bearing with us during this time. Our advice to road users is to plan ahead and allow additional time for travelling. Between Saturday 5 January and Monday 14 January, there will also be no pedestrian access across the level crossing. When travelling south we recommend vehicles use Crewe Road and Nantwich Bypass to access the south side of the B5074. If travelling north, we recommend using Nantwich Bypass and Crewe Road. The diversionary route will be clearly signposted.'

Year 11 Mocks

The Year 11 Mocks have run really well thus far. Well done to the students in taking them seriously and the mock results day will be on 11th January. Mr Mottram will send out details of how results will be shared with you.

Parent Governor Elections

The objective was to provide young people with an interactive insight into the world of work and test their skills in maths, economics and business in a global context. We are delighted that one of our Year 7 teams 'Prime Investors' won the competition and made more than a 50 per cent profit from their trading. Very well done to the team.

I hope that the information we provide on uniform helps you in your discussions during those long shopping trips with your child, by providing a very clear indication of our expectations and standards. 
