

Uniform Guidance

Uniform is vital in giving both the students and the school its identity and is fundamental to the school ethos. Uniform is about encouraging a sense of professionalism, high expectations as well as ensuring equity between all students.

All Students are required to follow the uniform dress code as well as ensuring the following:

- Piercings should only comprise of two studs, one in each ear, anything comprises health and safety for your child in school
- No hoodies, non-school jumpers (black V-neck) only
- We advise students to purchase a winter coat as pupils will be outside for all break and lunchtimes unless it is raining etc.
- Natural hair colours and no false nails or varnish
- Natural make up only, no false eyelashes
- No extreme haircuts no less than a number 2

If students do not follow this guidance then the pastoral team will contact parents to discuss the reasons for the breach in our dress code, and work with parents to address and rectify the breach. Deliberate breaches of the dress code could result in sanctions being applied such as a an afterschool detention.

Face Coverings

We are not advising or suggesting that any student should wear face coverings unless on public transport to and from school as it is not in the current government guidance to do so. However, if a student chooses to wear a face covering to school and wishes to remove it, they will need to dispose of it in one our lidded bins, if it's a washable face mask, it must be plain without any logos etc. Any student wearing a mask should follow this guidance below to ensure safe use.

- **Don't** put the mask around your neck or up on your forehead
- **Don't** touch the mask, and, if you do, wash your hands or use hand sanitizer to disinfect

If a student misuses a face covering in any way including not disposing of it correctly, this will compromise their safety and the safety of others and will be taken very seriously by the school and will be in breach of our behaviour policy.
