



Well done to Year 7


Students have already faced some of their biggest challenges.



Curriculum Structure

- Year group is split into Y and Z half: purely logistical for the school timetable
- Each year half has groups with a code, e.g. 7zEn3.

- We will gather data via continued assessment to inform us of your child's progress
 so we can best support your child in the classroom







• It is part of our tradition and something we look forward to every year.




What are we going to do?




Does everyone have to go?

- It would be fantastic if every student in Year 7 could take part in the visit. We feel that anyone who does not go on the residential will be missing a vital part of their school career in making new friends and building their confidence, as well as a very enjoyable experience.
- We know that some students may not have spent much time away from home before, but feel that it is a very important part of their growing up, helping them to learn to cope with feelings of 'homesickness'.
- Students will be divided into small groups with one teacher which will help them to feel more secure and we will do everything to ensure that their week is a happy one.

Further benefits

Accommodation:

What do students need to bring?

- Trousers/Jogging Pants/Leggings are better than Jeans when taking part in activities. Students can bring Jeans to wear in the evenings if they wish.
- Sweaters/Fleeces

Cashless Trip:

- The students do not need to bring any money
- There will not be an opportunity to buy anything from shops/gift shops/museums etc
- All food/drink/snacks have been included in the price of the trip



Medical:

- The Centre team are qualified in First Aid and we will have a dedicated team from Brine Leas who will oversee children taking medication and attend to any medical needs.
- It is a requirement that we are informed of any medical conditions that may affect your child whilst they are on this visit.
- Nearer the date of departure, you will be sent an email with a link to the Form C. Without a completed form your child will not be able to take part in the visit.
- If there is any additional information that you feel we should know; for example the loss of a close relative, a sudden change in circumstances or additional medical/emotional needs, please contact us on 01270 625663.
- Your child's safety and wellbeing are paramount.

Drop off and pick up?


- Parents/carers can drop children off with their bags at normal school time on the Monday.
